

NEWS FROM THE COMMUNITY



The Bennachie Community Council (BCC) is a group of elected local volunteers who liaise with Aberdeenshire Council and other groups to represent the views of the area. We meet on the fourth Monday of the month and our next meeting is on January 27th. We are still looking

for one new member each from Insch, Meikle Wartle / Durno and Premnay areas. If you want to help your community, please let us know at bennachieCC@outlook.com

The five main topics we are looking at just now which are keeping us really busy are: -

- 1. Insch Hospital and health care within our area.
- 2. Resilience Planning. Work is ongoing at looking at village hall resilience.
- 3. Community Action Plans and Local Place plans.
- 4. Developments within the area i.e. Coreen Windfarm and Battery Energy Storage at Meikle Wartle
- 5. We have also just started up a paths/green space group.

Healthcare in BCC area.

BCC has continued to try and work with Aberdeenshire Health and Social Care Partnership to progress the actions agreed when the Integration Joint Board decided not to reopen Insch Hospital after covid. With the Friends of Insch Hospital we have been trying to schedule a meeting with the Chair and officers of the IJB to find out why, two years after the IJB's decision not to reopen the hospital, there has been no progress on the three actions intended to offset the loss of inpatient beds. Although the Chair of the IJB had offered to hold a meeting, there now seems to be a reluctance to go ahead with that meeting.

As a result of government funding constraints NHS(Grampian) and AHSCP need to make significant cost reductions. Reserves have been used in prior years so the position is now critical. We have been working with AHSCP to keep abreast of what is happening and as far as possible influence local outcomes. We held a meeting with the AHSCP to understand the position, reviewed documents and sat in on the IJB budget meeting and have subsequently had a meeting with Aberdeenshire Council Garioch Area Manager and the local AHSCP management. There is a shortfall of some £17m this year so AHSCP are undertaking reviews of a lot of basic services, including all Community Hospitals and the Aberdeenshire Care Home estate. There are likely to be significant changes in services, although major changes will not be introduced until 2026. While we can't prevent this, BCC intends to be inside the tent to influence as far as we can local impacts.

Some good news on the healthcare front. The Friends of Insch Hospital have sourced some funding to run a dementia support group.

COMMUNITY ACTION PLAN

Work is ongoing implementing the actions that have been set out in the Community Action Plan which is available on our Bennachie Community Council website Home | Bennachie Community Council | Aberdeenshire.

Greenspaces + Paths

We have started a group looking at how we use our greenspaces and also a path group looking at creating paths to link up the villages in the area. Not only will this make it is easier for people who don't drive to get about but it will encourage us to walk or cycle more. This includes looking at safer crossing places on the A96. Local Development Trust

An initial meeting took place in January about whether a Development Trust for the area would be a good idea. This is basically setting up a company which earns money to be used for improving the social, economic and environmental good of the area. There was interest in finding out more about this and it was agreed to arrange another meeting to invite DTAS to speak about development trusts and also The Huntly Development Trust have kindly said they would come along and share their experiences regarding setting up and running at Development Trust. We are hoping this will take place in April.

Local Place Plans

95% of the people who responded to the Community Action Plan said they wanted a local place plan. This is basically a map of the area showing how the people who live in the area want to see their community grow in the next few years. It deals with how the land about us is used: where houses go, paths, green spaces, land

for commercial properties, pavements etc. You will start seeing lots of information about this on our Facebook page and website in April. We will also be coming to an event near you to ask your views. It is hoped to have the plans displayed at the Strawberry Fayre for you to comment on.

Resilience

We are working on finalising a resilience plan for the area. Chapel of Garioch Hall is now resilient and has back up power available in the case of a power cut. Our halls are the heart of our communities and we are lucky to have such dedicated volunteers who run these groups ensuring the halls survival.

When there is a weather/flood/fire/draught warning we share all the information about this on the Bennachie Community Council Facebook Page. Hopefully the snow has gone for this year but something we would like to make you aware of for next year is the Snow Warden Scheme. It actively supports members of the local community who wish to offer their spare time to manually clear snow from publicly-adopted footways and footpaths.

Travel

As part of the Community Action Plan, it was highlighted that the lack of public transport was an issue. One area we are working on is trying to provide transport for people to go to medical appointments. There is THINC - Travel advice for Health and Social Care appointments who give advice on travel and the Royal Voluntary Service who are looking for volunteers. Can you help them?

Royal Voluntary Service

The Royal Voluntary Service provide operational support to a few service areas across Scotland. Our Patient Transport Service in Aberdeenshire supports vulnerable older people to get to and from the hospital and vital medical appointments. We are urgently

Here is one volunteers story: -

Shortly after I retired, and as covid hit, I saw a request for RVS drivers. Somewhat delayed by Covid-19, I finished my induction, disclosure and training (mostly computer-based, and ongoing) in early 2021 and have been driving people to hospital or similar appointments, and sometimes shopping, ever since. More recently, I have also been driving a minibus to take groups on monthly shopping trips.

The joy of the work is meeting and talking to people from diverse backgrounds, many with a deep knowledge of the Garioch, its people and history, including names for local places that I've never heard of in 27 years living here.

The commitment is as much as you want to make it – perhaps three trips in a week or just one in three weeks.

It is satisfying to be able to help with short-notice jobs, when you can. Mileage is paid at the HMRC rate, but this and any other expenses can be donated.

TRANSPORT

As all options for the A96 Dualling come through BCC area. During the various consultations BCC has not supported any one option. However, the A96 Corridor Review developed a Refined Package of Interventions comprising of: - Active Communities; Improved Public Transport Passenger Interchange Facilities; Investment in Demand Responsive Transport (DRT) and Mobility as a Service (MaaS); Linespeed, Passenger and Freight Capacity Improvements on the Aberdeen to Inverness Railway Line; Elgin Bypass; Keith Bypass; Targeted Road Safety Improvements; and A96 Electric Corridor. The refined package is estimated to cost in the range of £501 million to £1 billion at 2022 prices, which compares with a range of £2.5 billion to £5 billion for dualling the A96 from the east of Nairn to Aberdeen. The interventions are beneficial and have no signify downsides for BCC residents so BCC is actively supporting these recommendations rather than the A96 dualling.

The A96 Corridor Review recognises many issues we had previously raised: lack of public transport in rural areas, disabled access to transport, traffic levels between Inverurie and Elgin do not meet Transport Scotland's threshold for dualling; reduction in commuting and business travel since the pandemic; tension between car reduction to meet climate change targets and increasing road capacity by dualling, increasing rail capacity; need for "joined up" local bus and rail services. The final selection in 2020 did nothing to alleviate congestion in Inverurie, goes through mature woodland and destroys some of the best arable farmland in Scotland.

BCC has responded to the Scottish Government consultation in support of the Refined Package of Interventions and has written to local MSP's asking them to support our position with the Cabinet Secretary. If the A96 dualling is not going to go ahead and it is imperative for our area that targeted road

safety improvements go ahead as soon as possible which are beneficial and have no signify downsides for BCC residents.

Aberdeenshire Council have published their proposed plans to implement the Scottish Parliament policy of **default 20mph speed limit** on roads thorough settlements. See the Home | Bennachie Community Council | Aberdeenshire website for more details.

National Speed management review. To contribute to a reduction in deaths and injuries on Scottish roads on November 27th 2024 the Scottish Government published proposals to lower the national speed limit on single carriageway roads from 60 mph to 50 mph and to increase speed limits for goods vehicles exceeding 7.5 tonnes on single carriageways from 40 mph to 50 mph and dual carriageways from 50 mph to 60 mph. There was public a consultation (now closed). The BCC publicised the relevant information on their Facebook page and provided a link so that interested people could respond.

Amey, who operate the A96 on behalf of Transport Scotland, have offered to come to a future BCC meeting to discuss A96 issues.

INSCH LIBRARY



Our library is going to remain open where it is. This is thanks to various groups of people who showed how important the library is to our community and also to those who showed their support. From the group who started the petition to save our library, to the Institute Trustees who worked with the Council to ensure it was viable for the library to stay where it was and to the people who worked on this in the background.

We are having a meeting with Aberdeenshire Council at the start of April to see how we can extend the opening hours to allow working parents to use the library. ENERGY DEVELOPMENTS IN OUR AREA

For certain large scale energy developments these have to go to the Energy Consent Unit to deal with and the Scottish Ministers determine these. These are for: -

- *Applications for consent for the construction, extension and operation of electricity generating stations with capacity in excess of 50 megawatts (applications below this threshold are made to Aberdeenshire Council local planning authority);
- *Applications for the installation of certain overhead electric lines and associated infrastructure;
- *Applications for necessary wayleaves to confer rights over land to install electric lines;
- *Compulsory purchase orders promoted under the Electricity Act 1989;
- *Applications for consent for large gas and oil pipelines.

We have two pre-planning applications for large energy infrastructure in our local area which will impact on us.

1.The Correen-Suie Windfarm and here is a link to the pre planning information for this <u>Scottish Government</u> - <u>Energy Consents Unit</u> - <u>Application Details</u>

These will be some of the tallest on shore wind turbines in the UK.

More up to date details can be found here about this windfarm which is for 10 wind turbines (8 at 200m tall and 2 at 180m tall – (Simalar size as those offshore Aberdeen)



Friends of Insch Hospital and Community Update

At our Trustees Meeting on 3rd March, after another year of exhausting every possible avenue to encourage

Aberdeenshire Health & Social Care Partnership (AHSCP) to reinstate healthcare services at Insch Hospital, we unanimously voted to explore a Community Asset Transfer (CAT). This would allow us to secure ownership of the hospital building and grounds for the community.

We have now informally lodged an interest, and while the process could be lengthy, we are tentatively positive—for the first time in a long while, we see a glimmer of hope for the future of the site. Should we be successful, there will be a significant challenge ahead in terms of funding and planning, but we are determined to explore every possibility to bring the building back into use for the benefit of the community.

With that in mind, this year's Strawberry Fair on Sunday, 8th June could be more important than ever. Fundraising at the fair may well play a vital role in any future project, so we encourage everyone to come along, support local stalls, and enjoy a brilliant day out with family and friends.

We are thrilled to share that Friends of Insch Hospital has been awarded £9,828 from Aberdeenshire Voluntary Action's Communities Mental Health & Wellbeing Fund! This funding will allow us to launch a dementia support group in Insch—something we know will make a real difference to those living with dementia and their loved ones. The group has now been scheduled for a Wednesday in the day room at Insch Hospital and will be called the Friends Wednesday Club. We are still putting provisions and staff in place but hope to launch very soon.








Looking forward to sunny days at The Studio.
